In commemoration of the 2015 Eritrea's Martyrs day, more than 500 people attended the solemn occasion at the Eritrean Association of Greater Seattle Community Center. The program started with a moment of silence to pay homage to the men and women who have paid the ultimate sacrifice for the freedom of their people and liberation of Eritrea. This was followed by singing our national anthem, which was led by our youth members of the YPFDJs.
