


Dr. **Amdetsion Kidane**, who was a professor of business administration at Howard University for more than three decades, died on Wednesday, May 4, 2016, at INOVA Fairfax Hospital, in Falls Church, Virginia; he was 77. Dr. Amdetsion, who authored several fiction and nonfiction works in Tigrigna, most of them dealing with the different aspects of his people's protracted search for freedom. He was also a poet with poetry for every Eritrean occasion.

He is survived by his wife, Mana Solomon, his children, Brook, Ezra and Ruth.

Dr. Amde's funeral services will be held at Fairfax Memorial, 9902 Braddock Road, Fairfax, VA 22032, on Monday, May 9, 2016, at 3 pm.



**Haile Abraham**, an information technology specialist by profession, passed away at Mount Vernon Hospital in Alexandria, VA, also on Wednesday, May 4, 2016, at the age of 64 years.



Haile was an active member of the Dehai Eritrean network almost from its beginning, where he contributed many passionate articles in defense of Eritrea.

Haile had a passion for life, sports and he was also involved in promoting music, film and other entertainment forms within the Eritrean culture. Haile was a member of the Eritrean National Holidays Coordinator Committee's media group and one of the organizer of the basketball competition around the Washington, DC festival.

Haile is survived by his son Matthew.
